I travelled to Nashville last Sunday to support a visit by our Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Michael Creed, T.D., who was on the first leg of a <u>programme</u> focused on Ireland's meat, dairy and beverage sectors and building on our trading relationships with North America.

Irish News

President Donald Trump has proclaimed March 2018 Irish-American Heritage Month.

The Tánaiste and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade, Simon Coveney, has welcomed the publication of the European Commission's proposed <u>draft EU-UK Withdrawal Agreement</u>. The Taoiseach and the British Prime Minister have remained in close contact on current BREXIT issues.

Earlier in February, the Tánaiste also undertook a 3-day visit to the US that included meeting with <u>Secretary of State Rex Tillerson</u> on Ireland's priorities in the Brexit negotiations, and a visit to UN headquarters as part of Ireland's campaign for election to the UN Security Council in 2020.

In NY on the 20th anniversary of the signing of the Good Friday Agreement, <u>Simon Coveney spoke</u> of the vital role played by Irish-America and US administrations in the Peace Process and reconfirmed Ireland's continued support for lasting and sustained reconciliation.

The Tánaiste launched a new Brexit website, www.dfa.ie/Brexit, with information on the Government's outreach and input on the negotiations.

Taoiseach Leo Varadkar and the Government launched <u>Project Ireland 2040</u>, a €116bn overarching plan to reimagine Ireland and prepare for the future. See: <u>www.gov.ie/en/project-ireland-2040</u>

The Taoiseach officially opened Microsoft's new 34,000sqm, €134m campus in Dublin, including an innovation and education hub that will host and inspire 100,000 primary and TY students over the next 4 years.

Chairing the 11th meeting of the Beef Roundtable ahead of his trade mission to the US, Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Michael Creed T.D., reflected on the <u>beef sector's increasing share</u> of international markets, up 5% in 2017 in the value of exports to €2.5billion and up 4% in volume.
