Statement of Ireland

Thank you, Mr. Vice President

Ireland warmly welcomes the delegation of Botswana and thanks it for its presentation today.

We commend Botswana on its extensive consultations with NGOs and other stakeholders in

advance of drafting its national report. We further note the progress made in many areas since

the last UPR cycle.

In particular, we welcome progress in relation to LGBTI rights - however, we are concerned

that consensual adult same-sex sexual activities remain criminalised under the Penal Code, and

that stigmatisation of LGBTI persons continues.

The death penalty remains an issue of concern. We are concerned that Botswana retains the

death penalty both in law and in practice. We therefore **recommend** once again that Botswana

agree to a moratorium on the death penalty as a first step towards its ultimate abolition.

Ireland recalls its previous recommendations in relation to violence against women and girls.

We regret that marital rape is still not recognised as a crime. We again recommend that

Botswana enact specific legislation on marital rape, and ensure that all violence against women

and girls constitutes a criminal offence.

We wish Botswana every success in this UPR cycle.
