Message from H.E. Éamonn Mac Aodha, Ambassador of Ireland to the Kingdom of Belgium

Following two hugely successful TradFest festivals in 2015 and 2016 I am delighted to present the programme for TradFest 2017.

The Embassy of Ireland initiated this festival in 2015 to bring Irish music and culture to the large Irish community in Belgium and also to a Belgian and wider international audience.

Visitor numbers from Belgium to Ireland have risen significantly in recent years and we hope that TradFest 2017 will attract even more people to discover all that Ireland has to offer.

This year TradFest events will take part in Brussels, Kraainem, Liège and Loker.

Events will include an art exhibition, Irish music, dance and language classes and a series of lunchtime literary events.

Talented, well-known Irish musicians and singers will travel from Ireland for the festival including Mary Black, Máirtín O'Connor Trio, Maighread and Tríona Ní Dhomhnaill, Liam Ó Maonlaí, Brú Ború, Na Fir Sneachta and many others, to join the large number of wonderful local and continental traditional musicians who are the inspiration for this festival.

We are particularly delighted that members of Na Píobairí Uilleann will join

us to give a master class introduction to the wonderful uilleann pipes.

The week-long programme could not have happened without the support of many volunteers



and sponsors and I would like to thank BNP Paribas Fortis in particular for their generous support.

A special word of thanks to Tom and Doreen Bourke for their enthusiasm and energy in leading fundraising efforts once again this year. Thanks too to all the members of our TradFest Committee for their positive input and advice.


Book Launch Thomas Burke : Messines to Carrick Hill

We are delighted to announce that Thomas Burke will join us to launch his book Messines to Carrick Hill. The book is structured around a collection of letters written by a nineteen year old Irish officer in the 6th Royal Irish Regiment, 2nd Lieutenant Michael Wall from Carrick Hill, near Malahide in north Co. Dublin. Michael was educated by the Christian Brothers in Dublin and destined to study science at UCD before being seduced



by the illusion

of adventure through war. By contextualising and expanding the content of Wall's letters and setting them within the entrenched battle zone of the Messines Ridge, Burke offers a unique insight into the trench life this young Irish man experienced, his disillusionment with war and his desire to get home.



Ronan McGreevy is an Irish times journalist and videographer. He is the author of Wherever the Firing Line Extends: Ireland and the Western Front. The book has been described by The Irish Independent as the "superlative and definitive account of Ireland in World War I". Often forgotten at home and written out of Irish history, the Irish soldiers and their regiments found themselves more honoured in foreign fields. From the first shot monument in



Mons to the plaque to the Royal Irish Lancers who liberated the town on Armistice Day 1918, McGreevy takes a tour of the Western Front. At a time when Ireland is revisiting its history and its place in the world, he looks at those places where the Irish made their mark and are remembered in the monuments, cemeteries and landscapes of France and Flanders.

Gay McKeon took an interest in uilleann piping in the 1960s under the tutelage of piper and pipe-maker Leo Rowsome at the Piper's Club on Thomas Street in Dublin's city centre. Since the mid 1970s Gay has toured and recorded extensively with artists including Christy Moore, Maddy Prior and June Tabor and has featured on albums including The Drones and Chanters Volume 2 and The Piper's Rock, as well as a solo album Irish Piping Tradition, and a trio CD The Dusty Miller with his two sons Conor and Seán. Gay has performed on three volumes of the tutor series The Art of Uilleann Piping and produced and directed publications including the Piper's Choice DVD series and numerous CD recordings published by Na Píobairí Uilleann. Gay teaches piping at summer schools and on a regular basis throughout the year. Serving on the Board of Na Píobairí Uilleann from 1987, Gay was Chairman from 2002 until 2006 when became CEO of the organisation.
